Courtesy Visits

On January 23, 2024, a delegation from the Lagos State Command of the Nigeria Immigration Service (NIS), led by Comp Bala Aliu Dangana, paid a courtesy visit to the LSSTF. The purpose of the visit was to express gratitude for the longstanding support provided to the agency and also use the medium to seek more support in the provision of technical, mechanical, and logistical resources, including operational vehicles and motorcycles.

Dr. Abdurrazaq Balogun, the Executive Secretary/CEO of LSSTF, emphasized the Fund's commitment to transparent and accountable operations. He also noted the significant challenges faced by Nigerians, specifically the manual input of passports at the airport causing delays, in contrast to the global practice of passport swiping.

He further inquired about potential collaboration between the Nigeria Customs Service and Nigeria Immigration Service to enhance security, facilitate ease of doing business around the borders, and boost investments in Nigeria.

Comp Bala responded that the new Comptroller General has started to reform the processes within the agency thereby improving the effectiveness and performance of the agency.

While thanking the team, the Executive Secretary/CEO assured them of LSSTF's unwavering support and cooperation in addressing the challenges discussed during the meeting.

Also, the new Commissioner of Police, CP Fayoade Adejoke, paid a courtesy visit to the Fund's office.

During the visit, the CP discussed extensively on the critical needs of the command which included the refurbishment of patrol vehicles, and Armoured Personnel Carriers (APC's), illumination of crime-prone areas in the state, etc.

He emphasized that there will be drastic reduction in crime-rate in the state during his tenure as measures have been put in place to curb all forms of illegality, unrest and criminal activities.

The Executive Secretary/CEO informed the team that discussions with vendors are already underway for the refurbishment of the APCs and patrol vehicles, while other needs will be considered.

He further enjoined the CP to encourage high net-worth individuals who visit the command to donate to the Fund towards the safety and security of the state.

The significant loss of security infrastructure experienced as a result of the aftermath of the EndSars protest has created a lacuna in the security space in the state and it has been estimated that to replace these assets it will cost the state about 30 Billion Naira conservatively. These assets include;

- Reconstruction of Police Stations,
- Ballistic Gears,
- Armored Personnel Vehicles (APCs),
- Communication Gadgets,
- Police Accoutrements,
- Patrol Vehicles,
- Anti-Riot Equipment, etc.

In addition, there are also funding needs in the area of fueling, welfare, training, more equipment procurement, maintenance & repairs.
